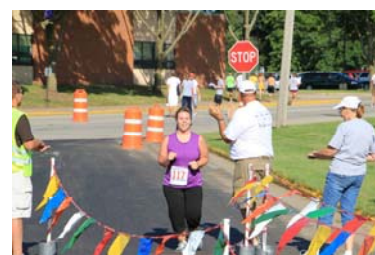
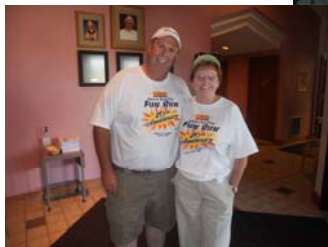
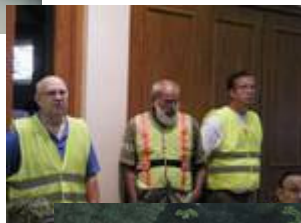
# **2011 KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS KORNFEST FUNRUN**

## DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHTS REPORT.....

*Without the worship, the gestures would be meaningless... -Cardinal Ratzinger 2002*



With the upcoming changes to the Roman Missal, many of us will struggle with the reintroduction of the scriptural phrasing. Although I do not remember the details of the changes in the entire Mass in the early 1970's, we see that the manmade constructs of our theological doctrines can and do change. Although traditions and teachings are the glue that holds us together, they are not absolute. For example, Canon 20 from the First Council of Nicene (A.D. 325) banned the act of kneeling during public prayer and liturgies:

Forasmuch, as there are certain persons who kneel on the Lord's Day and in the days of Pentecost, therefore, to the intent that all things may be uniformly observed everywhere (in every parish), it seems good to the holy Synod that prayer be made to God standing.

The early church saw Sunday as a joyous day, and associated kneeling with penitence or shame; a sign of bondage e.g. a prisoner in chains brought before his judge. Tertullian even went so far to say that we should not practice fasting on Sundays. This was a traditional construct found throughout the Bible:

Standing, each man in his place, they read from the Book of the Law of Yahweh their God. (Nehemiah 9:3)

And when you stand in prayer, forgive whatever you have against anybody, so your Father in heaven may forgive your failings to. (Mark 11:25)

From early on, the Church reserved the obligation for kneeling for private prayer. However, when one's prayers were somber or was in need of favor the petitioner would kneel, as when Solomon knelt when dedicating the temple (2 Chronicles 6:13), or as Christ did in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:24).

It was not until the Middle Ages that the posture of kneeling during the Consecration and Elevation found its way into tradition. Today, the Missal obligates us to kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer and the *Angus Dei*; unless otherwise determined by the Bishop, and allows kneeling after the reception of Holy Communion.

When we make absolute the conventions and gestures of man's construct we become like the Israelites in the desert with their golden cow. The sense of unity as a community is an essential feature of the mass, but it does not supersede our worship and giving thanks to the Lord our God. Three elements remain in all forms of the Mass the Word-God (CF John 1:1), the Sacrificial Offering – Christ (Matthew 26:26), and the Holy Spirit—the communal love for God dwelling in us (CCC: 813). Our focus is not to be on whether others manner and actions are appropriate but rather to our own heart and thoughts, toward the goodness of God and our fellow man. If so our actions will follow.

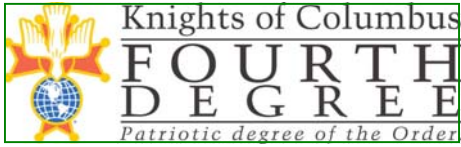

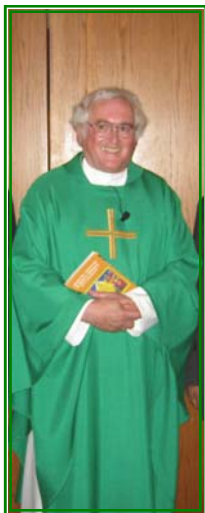

**Do you have coverage?**

**Greetings to all the Holmen, La Crosse and Onalaska Knights and families.** It seems like summer just began and here we are with another school year already underway. With that comes another round of busyness for all of our families. We know that with sports, music and school work, it can seem like there is no time left, but we just want to put out a friendly reminder of some of the area pro-life activities coming up this fall as well, and ask that you prayerfully consider joining in one, two or more of these.

First, there will be a kick-off rally for the fall 40 Days for Life prayer, fasting and community outreach campaign on Sunday, September 25th from 12:30-2:00 pm at the Southside Community Center (1300 6th St. S. La Crosse). If you have not participated in 40 Days for Life, yet, this is a great chance to meet people who have participated, ask questions and learn more about 40 Days for Life. If you have participated, this is a chance to meet more of your fellow prayer warriors.

Next, the 40 Days for Life prayer vigil will take place across from Gundersen-Lutheran Hospital (on the corner of 7th St. S. and South Ave.) from 6am-6pm everyday from Wednesday, September 28th through Sunday, November 6th. If you would like to sign up or get more information, please contact Elizabeth Garibaldi at 769-4014 or lizzdemos@yahoo.com or Marie Allen at 784-5189 or marie.v.allen@charter.net or visit the website at [www.40daysforlife.com/lacrosse](http://www.40daysforlife.com/lacrosse) One very easy way to participate in the 40 Days for Life campaign is to place a sign in your yard. The signs have "Pray to End Abortion" on one side and on the other, "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you..." with a beautiful picture of a child in the womb. This is a peaceful, visible witness to anyone who passes by your home. Yard signs will be available at the kick-off rally as well as at many area parishes in the weeks to come.

Finally, the 24th Annual Life Chain will take place on Respect Life Sunday, October 2nd from 2-3 pm. LIFE CHAIN is a peaceful and prayerful public witness of pro-life individuals standing for 60 minutes praying for our nation and for an end to abortion. It is a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community that abortion kills children and that the Church supports the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception until natural death. The La Crosse Life Chain will start on the corner of King St. and Losey Blvd. and run south on Losey. There will be signs available at several corners along Losey Blvd. Especially if you have never participated in a public prayer vigil, this is an excellent opportunity to stand with hundreds of pro-life individuals from our community and pray for an end to abortion.

Each year, our local Knights of Columbus hold Tootsie Roll drives to raise funds to assist people with intellectual disabilities. This is an extremely successful and worthwhile event. Some of these funds are used in various ways to help people who have Downs Syndrome. Did you know, after a prenatal diagnosis of Downs Syndrome, there is upward of a 90% chance that the child will be killed by abortion? We must continue to do the good we do in our communities, for those who need our help, whether for food, clothing, shelter or other assistance. But, we must also stand up for those who don't have a voice and those whose voices are silenced by abortion. We need men (Knights) to spread the word that there is hope and help for the women and men who feel that abortion is their only "choice."

Please, won't you take the challenge to stand for life for an hour, or an hour a week, during the 40 Days for Life campaign? If you've never done this before, ask someone who has to go with you. If you have done it before, invite a fellow Knight who hasn't and tell your brother Knights about your experience. As we suggested last year, maybe you could organize a "Knights night" (or afternoon) and get as many Knights and their families as you can to come together for an hour of prayer to end abortion. No effort is too small and none will be too much.

Here is a quote from Pope Saint Felix III to think about as you fill your fall calendar... "Not to oppose error is to approve it, and not to defend truth is to suppress it and indeed to neglect to confound evil men when we can is no less a sin than to encourage them."
